THE LESSONS - *The people sit if able*

The First Lesson (Genesis 2:18-24)

Reader: A reading from the Book of Genesis.

The Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner." So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creature, that was its name. The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner. So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man. Then the man said,

"This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken." Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

The Gospel (Mark 10:2-16)

Please stand, if able.

Celebrant: The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to St. Mark ♥

People: Glory to you Lord Christ.

Some Pharisees came, and to test Jesus they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife?" He answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her." But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate."

Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter. He said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery."

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it." And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

The Homily The Rev. Jon Roberts

Nicene Creed – All stand, where you are, if able, and say in unison.

WE believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

Storm Recovery Updates

Servpro began work on Saturday, September 28 with a full working crew that included mitigation efforts that accelerated over time. We can report that Calvary's mitigation (including removal of water, desiccation of entire building, overall evaluation of physical plant, removal of artifacts, evaluation and removal of inventory that was salvageable, tearing out interior walls 24" down, etc.) is 30% complete.

Complementing photos of evaluation have been recorded and published on our Facebook page to keep the parish apprised of the situation. The Executive Committee (Fr. Roberts, Julie, Gary, Karen and Lynne) have worked non-stop in the efforts of communicating to all parties involved,

including the Staff, Vestry, the Diocese, the Insurer, Servpro, and various committees, including Finance Committee, Altar Guild, Food Pantry, Prayer Team, etc.

The losses thus far are estimated to be in the range of \$750,000 - \$1M, but this is only an initial estimate as we are working with the process of vendor bids for repairs, replacements and refurbishing. There will be expected non-covered expenses where we will ask for assistance from FEMA, the parish and the local community. Aside from the mitigation of the church, as our largest expense, all furniture made of particle board will be replaced, the organ, certain speakers and electronics related, will be replaced, walls (24" down) will be replaced, and carpet replaced by new vinyl flooring in those areas. The Food Pantry inventory will need to be completely restocked. Sliding door replacements for Parish Hall and replacing the small conference room door with a window are projected.

Dumpsters are expected to arrive, and the removal of cabinetry and other damaged debris will be removed from property over the next two to three weeks.

If you are looking for certain things, please email Fr. Roberts or Karen LaCorte-Nies. Do not attempt to find things on your own or enter the building without permission. Most, if not all inventory has been removed to a satellite facility by Prism in St. Petersburg for evaluation.

Worship Expectations

We plan to have a simple service in front of the North Narthex this Sunday at 9am. Volunteers have said they can put out some folding chairs for the service that were not harmed by the storm. Due to the projected tropical depression getting near us, if there is wind and rain, we ask you remain at home and join us on a livestream as we did last Sunday.

Due to safety concerns, the interior of the church, although dry and entered by response teams and certain church leaders, we feel that it requires the next two weeks of recovery before we invite any parishioners to enter and gather. Those wishing to enter would be at risk at this time due to the construction underway. However, weather permitting, Fr. Roberts is offering for folks to "peer" inside the church from the north entrance but not go further than inside the narthex. We know how many of you want to go inside and look for yourselves but now is not the time. Again, the church is in a pre-construction phase and we must insure safety for all. The Facebook page has many photos and is very comprehensive.

The following Sunday, Oct. 13, Servpro is prepared to erect a full size tent with chairs for us to be under, if needed due to the sun and heat. On Sunday, Oct. 20, Servpro has been asked to clean sufficiently the interior of the sanctuary so that we may assemble. Until further notice, you will need to download the Sunday customary on your phone or tablet if you intend to read or sing along. Simple instrument or a capella, will direct our singing of hymns, led by Gabriel and Fr. Jon. Holy Eucharist at all services.

Join the Choir – Our first choir practice of the new season will be offsite. Bells suffered damage, and we will wait until they are refurbished. We welcome people of all musical abilities. Gabriel Johnston will contact both choirs.
